

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Trinity/Gourlay Prize

Acceptable use of Trinity/Gourlay Prize funding

- The prize money can be used to produce educational output (teaching resource), such as a published case for classroom teaching, a video, a game, or a TED Talk, etc; and or for research activity linked to the educational output, including salaries for research assistance and travel costs for relevant fieldwork.
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Practice-focused & Knowledge sharing

- The educational output created with the funds will be **presented at the subsequent ABEN conference** and will be shared via ABEN's website, subject to copyright restrictions of the publishers of such output and intellectual property rights of the authors.
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Collaboration

- Shortlisted finalists (up to 4 projects) will be invited to give a 10-15min presentation at the ABEN annual conference (held in November or December each year at a different city in Australasia).
 - The shortlisted finalist(s) presentation and discussion is designed as a collaborative, non-competitive exchange of ideas on business ethics education, and is not a pitch or assessment forum for the prize.
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Awarding the funding

- The judging panel will include members from the ABEN Committee and a representative of Trinity College, such as the Gourlay Fellow in Business Ethics. The panel may award the prize amount of AU\$10,000 to one finalist or to divide it among multiple finalists as appropriate.

Application

- Develop your application using the **word template** on ABEN's website
- Please include details about the idea for your teaching resource (i.e., title, aims and objectives, benefits for intended audience, project description, intended outcomes, timeline and budget).
- Submit the word application to ABEN via email.

Awarding the Prize

- The judging panel will include members from the ABEN Committee and a representative of Trinity College, such as the Gourlay Fellow in Business Ethics.
- If Shortlisted, you will be asked to give a 10-15min presentation at the ABEN annual conference to share your ideas with the ABEN community followed by a Q&A session.
- The shortlisted finalist(s) presentation and discussion is designed as a collaborative, non-competitive exchange of ideas on business ethics education, and is not a pitch or assessment forum for the prize.

Creating teaching resource

- With the awarded funds, the Recipient(s) will create the teaching resource (i.e., tools/ materials) within a year of receiving the funds.

Knowledge sharing and Dissemination

Once created, the Recipient(s) will share their teaching resource in two ways

1. Presentation at the subsequent ABEN conference (i.e., awarded in 2026 with the teaching resource shared in 2027).
2. In a user-friendly format to be shared via ABEN's website.



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
